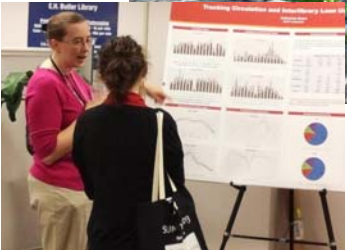

GRANTS & AWARDS

SUNYLA sponsors the following scholarships, grants, and awards:

Professional Development Grant

A small grants program that is used to reimburse members for expenses associated with professional growth activities when other funding sources are only partially or not available.

Daniel F. Kissane Memorial Scholarship

Financial assistance is available for a current library school student to attend the annual SUNYLA conference. Its purpose is to offer an introduction to academic librarianship, provide professional growth opportunities, and encourage involvement with SUNYLA.

Sylvia Chu Memorial Scholarship

Financial assistance is available for new SUNYLA members to attend the annual conference. The scholarship aims to encourage involvement with SUNYLA and to provide opportunities for professional growth for its members.
